MMR Vaccination Information

Vaccination UK have been instructed by NHSE to administer the MMR vaccination to all school aged children who are outstanding one or both doses. The MMR would have been given at the age of 1 year and the second dose at 3 years and 4 months. There has been an outbreak of Measles in the West Midlands which have been on the rise within the last few weeks.

If your child is outstanding one or both doses of the MMR, please contact their office on 01902 200077 to make an appointment. This will be at an alternative venue and NOT at the school. Alternatively, pop-up vaccine clinics are offering the MMR vaccine for children aged 5 years and over and adults who have missed a dose.

The clinics will be staffed by trained healthcare professionals from the NHS and Vaccination UK who specialise in childhood vaccinations and follow all necessary safety protocols. Children will need to be accompanied by a parent or guardian at the clinics.

The next set of clinics are:

- Saturday 27 January, 10:00am-4:00pm, Park Village Education Centre, Cannock Road, **Wolverhampton**, WV10 0RA. Walk in, no appointment needed.
- Saturday 27 January, 9:00am-3:00pm, vaccination van located at Bilston Market, Pinfold Street, **Wolverhampton**, WV14 0DN. Walk in, no appointment needed.
- Saturday 3 February, 9:00am-3:00pm, vaccination van located outside Poundland/Pep&Co in **Walsall** Town Centre, Lower Hall Lane, St Matthews Quarter, WS1 1PU. Walk in, no appointment needed.

Wolverhampton HAF Programme - February Half Term Activities

The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme provides eligible children and young people with free holiday activities and food in the long school holidays. The City of Wolverhampton Council has been awarded funding from the Department for Education to deliver a Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme, as part of a national scheme. The council will be delivering HAF through a network of providers at a wide variety of venues across the city. **To view the activities available please use the QR code below.**

Who can take part?

The programme will offer free holiday activities to school-aged children, who are in Reception –Year 11 (inclusive), and who are in receipt of benefits-related free school meals.

This programme is also open to:

- Those receiving free school meals from households with NoRecourse to Public Funds (NRPF).
- Children and young people aged 5 – 25 with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and/or children and young people aged 5– 25 with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) or additional needs.
- Children aged 5 – 18 known to local social services within the last three months.

Eligible children and young people are entitled to:

- at least four hours each day
- four days over the spring and winter holidays and sixteen days over the summer holidays
- a nutritious meal each day they attend the camp



Letters confirming HAF eligibility including a child's unique HAF code number are mailed out shortly before each big school holiday. If you have lost or mislaid your letter or if your child has become eligible within the past few months, you can obtain code numbers from the dedicated HAF helpline **01902 916994** which goes live shortly before each main school holiday.

Soccer 2000 Holiday Camp - February Half Term at Christ Church Juniors

During February half term we are trialling a holiday camp which will be led by Soccer 2000. The camp is free for any Christ Church Infant or Junior children and will run from Monday 12th – Friday 16th February.

The day starts at 9.00am and finishes at 3.00pm and will be held in the **Junior school hall**. Lunch will be provided free of charge unless you wish your child to take a packed lunch. Any free lunches must be pre-ordered on the form via the link below. The children will take part in multi- sports activities throughout the day so will need suitable sportswear and a water bottle.

The holiday club will have 32 places which will be allocated on a first come first serve basis. If your child is allocated a place on the camp, you will receive a full consent form from Soccer 2000. If your child is not allocated a place as all places are taken, you will be notified via text message.
