Fair Trade Chocolate Sale



Eco-Tip of the Week!

This is our first 'eco-tip' for the newsletter!

We all know about recycling but there are certain 'problem' items which end up in landfill. More information can be found at https://www.terracycle.com/en-GB/ Terracycle have lots of scheme to recycle all kinds of things.

We are joining the crisp packet recycling scheme. From Monday 2nd March we will have a collection point in the hall which will accept all brands of crips packets and multipack outer packaging. Packets need to be completely empty, not folded into triangles. The packets do not need to be washed. Terracycle will make the packets into plastic pellets which will be used to make a range of new recycled products.
